Presenter Guide

This guide helps you prepare a clear and engaging presentation. It focuses on sharing ideas in a way that is easy to understand and inclusive for everyone.

1. 🎯 Focus on 3 main ideas

- Think about the **three key messages** you want people to remember.
- Share ideas that get people thinking, for example: “*Here’s something to consider*”.
- You don’t need to cover everything – your role is to **start a conversation**.

2. 🌍 Be respectful and inclusive

- People’s **culture, identity, and life experiences** shape how they see the world.
- Don’t assume everyone is the same—each person and community is different.
- Use examples that reflect the **diversity of older people in Queensland**.
- Think about **whose voices are included** and who might be missing.
- Where possible, talk about ways to support **safety, rights, and respect**.

3. 📄 Keep slides simple and clear

- Use **simple visuals** and only a small amount of text.
- Avoid crowded slides or too much data.
- Use **plain language** and avoid jargon.
- Speak clearly and at a steady pace.
- Make sure your words and images are **respectful and easy to understand**.

Extra Tips:

- **Keep it short:** Stay focused and manage your time.
- **Encourage participation:** Invite questions and discussion.
- **Pause:** Give people time to think and respond.
- **Use positive language:** Highlight the strengths and abilities of older people.
